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Do I have an increased risk for colon cancer? Self assessment

Does one of your close relatives (parents, brothers, sisters, children) suffer from colon cancer? If so, at what age did the cancer occur?		
Are you 50 years of age or older?		
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Do you suffer from chronic inflammatory bowel disease?		
Are you having digestion problems for a longer period of time?		
Are you NOT excercising regularly?		
Do you eat a lot of meat and greasy food?		
Is your nutrition low in fibers?		
Are you overweight?		
Do you smoke?		
Do you drink more than 2 glasses of wine or beer?		

Conclusion:

If you answered one of the first 3 questions with yes you should see your doctor and ask him to transfer you for a colonoscopy.

If you answered one of the other questions with yes you should regard

yourself at increased risk for colon cancer, and discuss this issue with your doctor at your next visit.
